Calls for service:

2022: 6,978

2021: 7,032

2020: 6,905

2019: 6,607

Call types

1814 reported criminal offences (26% of all calls)

Property/Fraud/Mischief: 53%

Disturbances/breach: 28%

Persons offences: 14%

Top 5 calls for service

- 1. Abandon 911 / False alarms (16%)
- 2. Disturbances (7%)
- 3. Suspicious person/trespassing (6%)
- 4. Bylaw complaints (6%)
- 5. Well-being checks (6%)

Trending offences:

Frauds: Typically targeting seniors. Over \$1M in losses in 2022. The detachment provides confidential assessments of any request for money or other personal information.

Catalytic converter thefts: The reporting requirements under the Metal Dealers and Recyclers Act appear to not have the intended effective.

Impaired driving: 101 drivers intercepted under the influence of alcohol or drugs.


Road Safety

Automatic Licence Plate Recognition: 2 vehicles now equipped.


Loud vehicles: inspections will continue

Looking at 2023

- Renewed strategic plan
 - The 2020-2023 strategic priorities for the detachment are ready for renewal as informed by the community and council.
- Increasing community policing capacity: volunteer recruitment.
- Body-worn cameras:
 - End of 2023 or into 2024 for implementation.
- Local expertise developed:
 - Proactive Support Response Team psychological health for critical incidents
 - Crisis Negotiator expert crisis communications
 - Division Liaison Team specialist in unlawful protest resolution
 - Underwater Recovery Team Diver
