4.1 CHAIRPERSON CALLS FOR SPEAKERS TO QUESTION AND ANSWER PERIOD

 P. Petrala, White Rock, stated the image of pier camera has been fuzzy the past few days and inquired who cleans the camera lens and adjusts the focus?

- Staff look after the pier camera and the Chief Administrative Officer noted that they have put in a facility works ticket asking this be addressed.
- P. Zheng, White Rock, commented / concern with sidewalk width on Russell Avenue, noting it is not conducive to the neighborhood high-rises / density.
- G. Gumley, White Rock, inquired if there was a reason the City did
 not ask the City Auditors, KPMG, to comment on the \$115M of
 differences in the amount of cash that has come into the City over
 the last three (3) years as part of the audited financial statements.
 Staff noted KPMG are independent auditors, staff at this time do
 not have any questions.
- S. Lindenberger, White Rock, inquired what the current surplus for White Rock City is. Staff stated the current accumulated surplus at the end of 2024 was \$290M (investment and tangible capital assets [roads, buildings, sidewalks, underground utilities] at \$152.3M, remainder consisting of restricted reserves and other surplus funds). How much is in the restrictive reserves? Staff noted a hard copy of the Financial Plan is available for review.
- E. Klassen, White Rock, recently elected Member of Parliament (MP), notified of his resignation from City Councillor on May 9, 2025. Thanked Council, staff and the residents for their support over the past 2.5 years. Notified that the remaining surplus funds from his 2022 municipal election campaign (\$7,500) have been forwarded to the City of White Rock, as he won't be running in the next election, and he requested Council consider utilizing the funds for the warming centre.
