Sprung Structures

A Better Way To Build Rapid Construction. Design Flexibility. Performance & Durability. Lower Overall Costs.



Project Overview:

Client: West Point Grey Academy

Challenge: This school is situated on First Nations land. Due to building approval and location constraints, this structure is considered a temporary facility with a 10-year plan for use. West Point Grey's vision, in addition to adding the gymnasium, was to create an outdoor learning commons space for multipurpose activities. During the major site excavation phase indigenous artifacts were discovered thus triggering an archeological assessment.

Solution: 70' wide by 120' long Sprung Structure fully insulated, bright white Dupont Tedlar architectural membrane Two - 60' wide x 8' high glazing walls and Two - 14'3' wide x 12'6' long vestibules for storage

Time-line: Construction - 2.5 months

Results: The structure is being used as a full-time gym and part time auditorium. The grand opening was held in early September 2018 and was well received by all levels of participating groups including the parents, group, board of directors and all levels of West Point Grey Academy staff.

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- Immediate Delivery from Inventory Complete projects in a much shorter time-frame than conventional construction.
- Spacious Environment Provide a bright and spacious playing environment with a tall peak height, fortified with a fully tensioned white interior membrane.
- Sunlight and a Bright, Welcoming Space Allow more natural light to penetrate and brighten the interior space with daylight panels and glazing walls.
- Superior Performing Insulation System Achieve exceptional performance as well as lower operating and energy costs with Sprung's airtight building envelope and fully lofted fiberglass insulation system.
- Rapid Construction Schedule Significantly reduce construction costs and timelines compared to conventional construction.

BENEFITS OF PRE-ENGINEERED STRUCTURES



SURF Architecture has had on-going dialogue with The City of White Rock to resolve preliminary design considerations that include:

- General form and character of the proposed building
- Siting the building to avoid the removal of existing trees
- Inclusion of sprinkler protection
- Site perimeter storm water drainage
- Tie-in with off-site services
- Proximity to the nearest fire hydrant
- Potential use of adjacent municipal land
