SUBJECT: 2023 Fees and Charges Bylaw Amendment – 2023 Waterfront Parking Rates

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council receive the March 27, 2023, corporate report from the Director of Planning & Development Services, titled “2023 Fees and Charges Bylaw Amendment – 2023 Waterfront Parking Rates” for consideration.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to bring forward an amendment to the city’s Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 2447 to update the Waterfront Parking rates in accordance with the direction of Council during 2023 budget discussions.

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INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND

At the March 13, 2023 Finance and Audit Committee meeting direction was given to increase the waterfront parking rates by \$0.25 for 2023. Direction was also given to adjust the summer and winter seasons to include the following, eliminating the shoulder season:

- Summer: March 1 to October 31
- Winter: November 1 to last day of February

Staff have prepared a bylaw amendment for Council consideration, attached as Appendix A, for the revised fees to become effective May 1, 2023.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Adjustments to the 2023 draft budget will be made to incorporate anticipated increases in revenue as a result of the revised waterfront parking rates.

INTERDEPARTMENTAL INVOLVEMENT/IMPLICATIONS

The Finance Department assisted with the preparation of this report and bylaw amendment and will incorporate the anticipated revenue increases into the draft 2023 budget.

ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

This amendment is aligned with Council’s strategic priority to Increase Revenue from city programs, assets, and services.

OPTIONS / RISKS / ALTERNATIVES

The following options are available for Council’s consideration:

1. Not grant readings to Fees and Charges Amendment Bylaw No. 2460; or
2. Refer to staff for additional information.

Not granting reading or referral to staff will result in implementation delays, which may impact anticipated waterfront parking revenues in 2023.

Staff have prepared this report and bylaw amendments in accordance with March 13, 2023 Finance and Audit Committee recommendations and


