Mayor Knight on behalf of Council acknowledged David's remarkable longstanding service and contributions to our community.

4.1 CHAIRPERSON CALLS FOR SPEAKERS TO QUESTION AND ANSWER PERIOD

 G. Purewal, New Westminster, inquired regarding a building permit that was applied for as to the length of time it was taking and inquired if there was a measure of procedures as to how much time it will takes for building permits to be issued. The Mayor noted that funds have been put in place to hire two (2) additional positions however the issue is getting qualified persons to apply. There has been an additional hire of a contractor to help with applications. This is a top priority of this Council.

 I. Herysz, White Rock, wanted to know what can be done about the City's removal of a mirror (to help address traffic safety) at Beachview Avenue and Buena Vista Avenue, would like the mirror put back up due to safety issues when driving and provided a petition with 40 signatures noting the following:

"We, the undersigned Residents and Owners of Properties on Beachview Avenue, would like a prompt resolution to the traffic problems and risks created by the removal of the Mirror which had been mounted for many years on Buena Visa Avenue at the intersection of Beachview Avenue. The undersigned all agree that when properly maintained, the mirror which had been there previously was incredibly helpful in order to see Eastbound traffic approaching on Buena Vista Avenue. The removal of the mirror has since caused problems for the residents of Beachview Avenue. We can no longer see approaching traffic without puling so far out into the intersection that we place ourselves at risk. Many residents of Beachview Avenue have brought this concern forward to the City and to Council and still nothing has been done to resolve the issue. Please replace the mirror ASAP".

The Mayor will speak with Mr. Herysze.

 C. Shields, White Rock, supports the mirror being replaced at Beachview Avenue and Buena Vista (previous topic) due to safety concerns; noted concern with building permit timelines stating there are funds available to help with this and software to help digitize / streamline the process; and, further with the Council Code of Conduct, ensuring it is being adhered to.

Staff noted the building permit timelines are a priority and in this case it is not funding that is the issue as Council have provided funds, it is getting qualified people to apply for the position of Building Inspector 3.

Bylaw 2467 received first and second reading on April 17, 2023, and was the subject of a public hearing on May 15, 2023. Bylaw 2467 is on the agenda for further consideration at this time.

Note: It was found there was an error on the amended bylaw, under the Intent and not within the body, that received initial

readings on April 17, 2023 in regard to the new units. There is no amendment from what was advertised for the public hearing that was held on May 15, 2023 or what was summarized about the bylaw however under the Intent it was not amended correctly and noted a total of a 121-unit residential development (not including the information from Building A).

The correct number of units for both buildings A and B and what the bylaw encompasses is a 203-unit residential development and the bylaw attached reflects this change within Schedule 2.
