SUBJECT: 2024 Grants-in-Aid

RECOMMENDATION

THAT Council receive the March 25, 2024, corporate report from the Director of Financial Services, titled "2024 Grants-in-Aid" for consideration, and direct staff on the allocation of the 2024 Grants-in-Aid funding available.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides information on the 2024 Grants-In-Aid ("GIA") requests to assist Council in allocating the 2024 GIA funding available - \$25K.

INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND

The City's criteria and process for administering GIA are provided for in City Council Policy No. 302, a copy of which is attached as Appendix A. This Policy was revised at the March 11, 2024, Council meeting as follows: to merge the Arts and General GIA streams into one single program (stream); to reduce the maximum grant to \$1,000 for all applications; and, to give preference to applications for new events or programs. The policy also gives lower priority to those organizations who receive other funding from the City, for example a permissive tax exemption (PTE).

After applications are received, the Finance Department reviews applications for completeness and eligibility as per the policy. Any comments about the applications are noted in the 'Summary of Grant-in-Aid Applications' section of this report.

The City received 29 GIA applications for the 2024 program with a total of \$60,500 requested. Of these, the application from the BC Feed the Kids Foundation was subsequently withdrawn as they require minimum funding of \$7,500 which is outside the scope of the current GIA program. Grant maximums were adjusted as per the recent policy changes, resulting in a total eligible request of \$27,500 for the 2024 program.

If Council were to allocate \$1K per application to all of the applications received from organizations that are not already receiving a property tax exemption, or other funding, from the City, the total awarded would equal \$21K. This would leave \$4K to allocate amongst the applications from organizations who already receive some form of funding or tax exemption from the City or alternatively, due to the change in policy after applications were made, allocate additional funding over the \$1,000 maximum of the new policy, during this transition year.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The budget for the 2024 GIA program is included in the City's financial plan bylaw at \$25K.

ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

The allocation of grants from the City's GIA program aligns with Council's strategic priorities.

CONCLUSION

Council has sole discretion as to the allocation of the General GIA funding.
